

Since 1968, LAYC has grown from a small grassroots recreation center into a nationally recognized agency serving all lowincome youth. Each year LAYC serves over 4,000 youth and families through youth centers, school-based sites, and public charter schools in the District of Columbia and Maryland's Prince George's and Montgomery Counties.

Our mission is to empower a diverse population of youth to achieve a successful transition to adulthood through multicultural, comprehensive, and innovative programs that address youths' social, academic, and career needs.

From October 1, 2022 - September 30, 2023, MMYC's Prince George's site:

- Served a total of 905 youth
- Provided 253 youth with HIV testing
- Coordinated 49 on-site food security events and distributed over 9,000 food bags
- Connected 200 Prince George's County Public School students with a Promotor to access long-term, intensive case management and mentorship
